



APPLICABILITY:

Section 177 of the Companies Act, 2013 requires every listed company and such class or classes of companies, as may be prescribed to establish a vigil mechanism for the directors and employees to report genuine concerns in such manner as may be prescribed.

Effective October 1, 2014, Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement between listed companies and the Stock Exchanges, inter alia, provides for a mandatory requirement for all listed companies to establish a mechanism called "Whistle Blower Policy" for employees to report to the management instances of unethical behavior, actual or suspected, fraud or violation of the company's code of conduct.

SHORT TITLE:

In compliance of the requirements, Vimal Oil & Foods Limited (VOFL) being a Listed Company has established a Vigil (Whistle Blower) Mechanism and formulated a Policy in order to provide a framework for responsible and secure whistle blowing/vigil mechanism.

POLICY OBJECTIVES:

The Vigil (Whistle Blower) Mechanism aims to provide a channel between the Directors and employees to report genuine concerns about unethical behaviour, actual or suspected fraud or violation of the Codes of Conduct or policy.

The Company is committed to adhere to the highest standards of ethical, moral and legal conduct of business operations and in order to maintain these standards, the Company encourages its employees who have genuine concerns about suspected misconduct to come forward and express these concerns without fear of punishment or unfair treatment.

The mechanism provides for adequate safeguards against victimization of Directors and employees to avail of the mechanism and also provide for direct access to the Chairman of the Audit Committee in exceptional cases.

This neither releases employees from their duty of confidentiality in the course of their work nor can it be used as a route for raising malicious or unfounded allegations about a personal situation.



DEFINITIONS:

The definitions of some of the key terms used in this Policy are given below. Capitalised terms not defined herein shall have the meaning assigned to them under the Code.

- 1. "Associates" means and includes vendors, suppliers and others with whom the Company has any financial or commercial dealings.
- 2. "Audit Committee" means the Audit Committee of Directors constituted by the Board of Directors of the Company in accordance with Section 177 of the Companies Act, 2013 and read with Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement with the Stock Exchanges.
- 3. **"Employee"** means every employee of the Company (whether working in India or abroad), including the directors in the employment of the Company.
- 4. "Code" means the Tata Code of Conduct.
- 5. "Director" means every Director of the Company, past or present.
- 6. **"Investigators"** mean those persons authorised, appointed, consulted or approached by the Ethics Counsellor / Chairman of the Audit Committee and includes the auditors of the Company and the police.
- 7. **"Protected Disclosure"** means any communication made in good faith that discloses or demonstrates information that may evidence unethical or improper activity.
- 8. **"Subject"** means a person against or in relation to whom a Protected Disclosure has been made or evidence gathered during the course of an investigation.
- 9. "Whistleblower" means an Employee or director making a Protected Disclosure under this Policy.

Scope:

The Policy is an extension of the Code of Conduct for Directors & Senior Management Personnel and covers disclosure of any unethical and improper or malpractices and events which have taken place/suspected to take place involving:

- 1. Breach of the Company's Code of Conduct.
- 2. Breach of Business Integrity and Ethics.
- 3. Breach of terms and conditions of employment and rules thereof.



- 4. Intentional Financial irregularities, including fraud, or suspected fraud.
- 5. Deliberate violation of laws/regulations.
- 6. Gross or Willful Negligence causing substantial and specific danger to health, safety and environment.
- 7. Manipulation of company data/records.
- 8. Pilferation of confidential/propriety information.
- 9. Gross Wastage/misappropriation of Company funds/assets.

ELIGIBILITY:

All Employees of the Company and various stakeholders of the company are eligible to make Protected Disclosures under the Policy in relation to matters concerning the Company.

DISQUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. While it will be ensured that genuine Whistleblowers are accorded complete protection from any kind of unfair treatment as herein set out, any abuse of this protection will warrant disciplinary action.
- 2. Protection under this Policy would not mean protection from disciplinary action arising out of false or bogus allegations made by a Whistleblower knowing it to be false or bogus or with a *mala fide* intention.
- 3. Whistle Blowers, who make any Protected Disclosures, which have been subsequently found to be mala fide, frivolous or malicious, shall be liable to be prosecuted.

RECEIPT AND DISPOSAL OF PROTECTED DISCLOSURES:

- 1. All Protected Disclosures should be reported in writing by the complainant as soon as possible after the Whistle Blower becomes aware of the same so as to ensure a clear understanding of the issues raised and should either be typed or written in a legible handwriting in English.
- 2. The Protected Disclosure should be submitted in a closed and secured envelope and should be super scribed as "Protected disclosure under the Whistle Blower policy". Alternatively, the same can also be sent through email with the subject "Protected disclosure under the Whistle Blower policy". If the complaint is not super scribed and closed as mentioned above, it will not be possible for the Audit Committee to protect the complainant and the protected disclosure will be dealt with as if a normal disclosure. In order to protect identity of the complainant, the Whistle & Ethics



Officer will not issue any acknowledgement to the complainants and they are advised neither to write their name/address on the envelop nor enter into any further correspondence with the Whistle & Ethics Officer. The Whistle & Ethics Officer shall assure that in case any further clarification is required he will get in touch with the complainant.

- 3. The Company shall not entertain anonymous/pseudonymous disclosures.
- 4. The Protected Disclosure should be forwarded under a covering letter signed by the complainant. The Whistle and ethics Officer or to the Chairman of the Audit Committee/CEO as the case may be, shall detach the covering letter bearing the identity of the Whistle Blower and process only the Protected Disclosure.
- 5. All Protected Disclosures should be addressed to the Whistle and Ethics Officer of the Company or to the Chairman of the Audit Committee/ CEO/ Chairman in exceptional cases. The contact details of the Whistle and Ethics Officer / Vigilance Officer are as under:-

- 7. On receipt of the protected disclosure the Whistle and Ethics Officer / Chairman/ CEO/ Chairman of the Audit Committee, as the case may be, shall make a record of the Protected Disclosure and also ascertain from the complainant whether he was the person who made the protected disclosure or not. The record will include:
 - Brief facts;
 - ➤ Whether the same Protected Disclosure was raised previously by anyone, and if so, the outcome thereof:
 - Whether the same Protected Disclosure was raised previously on the same subject;
 - > Details of actions taken by Whistle Officer / Chairman/ CEO for processing the complaint;
 - Findings of the Audit Committee;
 - The recommendations of the Audit Committee/ other action(s).
- 8. The Audit Committee, if deems fit, may call for further information or particulars from the complainant.

NVESTIGATION:

- ➤ All Protected Disclosures under this policy will be recorded and thoroughly investigated. The Vigilance Officer will carry out an investigation either himself/herself or by involving any other Officer of the Company/ Committee constituted for the same /an outside agency before referring the matter to the Audit Committee of the Company.
- ➤ The Audit Committee, if deems fit, may call for further information or particulars from the complainant and at its discretion, consider involving any other/additional Officer of the Company and/or Committee and/ or an outside agency for the purpose of investigation.
- The investigation by itself would not tantamount to an accusation and is to be treated as a neutral fact finding process.
- The investigation shall be completed normally within 90 days of the receipt of the protected disclosure and is extendable by such period as the Audit Committee deems fit.
- Any member of the Audit Committee or other officer having any conflict of interest with the matter shall disclose his/her concern /interest forthwith and shall not deal with the matter.





DECISION AND REPORTING

- ➤ If an investigation leads to a conclusion that an improper or unethical act has been committed, the Chairman of the Audit Committee shall recommend to the Board of Directors of the Company to take such disciplinary or corrective action as it may deem fit.
- Any disciplinary or corrective action initiated against the Subject as a result of the findings of an investigation pursuant to this Policy shall adhere to the applicable personnel or staff conduct and disciplinary procedures.
- A quarterly report with number of complaints received under the Policy and their outcome shall be placed before the Audit Committee and the Board.
- A complainant who makes false allegations of unethical & improper practices or about alleged wrongful conduct of the Subject to the Vigilance Officer or the Audit Committee shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary action in accordance with the rules, procedures and policies of the Company.

PROTECTION:

No unfair treatment will be meted out to a Whistle Blower by virtue of his/ her having reported a Protected Disclosure under this policy. Adequate safeguards against victimisation of complainants shall be provided. The Company will take steps to minimize difficulties, which the Whistle Blower may experience as a result of making the Protected Disclosure.

The identity of the Whistle Blower shall be kept confidential to the extent possible and permitted under law. Any other employee assisting in the said investigation shall also be protected to the same extent as the Whistle Blower.



DISQUALIFICATIONS:

Access to Chairman of the Audit Committee:

The Whistle Blower shall have right to access Chairman of the Audit Committee directly in exceptional cases and the Chairman of the Audit Committee is authorized to prescribe suitable directions in this regard.

COMMUNICATION:

Directors and Employees shall be informed of the Policy by publishing on the notice board and the website of the Company.

RETENTION OF DOCUMENTS:

All Protected disclosures in writing or documented along with the results of Investigation relating thereto, shall be retained by the Company for a period of 5 (five) years or such other period as specified by any other law in force, whichever is more.

AMENDMENT:

The Company reserves its right to amend or modify this Policy in whole or in part, at any time without assigning any reason whatsoever. However, no such amendment or modification will be binding on the Directors and employees unless the same is not communicated in the manner described as above.
